
Scholarship Funding

SCIL's Art Program a Great Success!

We are deeply gratified by the wide range of interest and generous support that is building for SCIL's first formal art program launched last year with "A Labor of Love--Sailor Valentines of the Victorian Era." SCIL's first series of art classes last year were filled to capacity. We held two major exhibits in New Bedford and developed the publication of an art calendar for 2010 containing photographic images of works from the exhibits. The works have been so well received that we are undertaking a second year of this series. SCIL has been awarded its very first Cultural Council Grant by the City of Fall River to support our plan to repeat the classes this year and develop a Fall River venue for an exhibit. We also have been invited to return to New Bedford's Working Waterfront Festival next September. The program is so popular that the new spring classes are filled to capacity already.



A Success Story - Andrew Dufault

When Andrew first came to SCIL at 16 years of age as a TAP consumer, he was living with his parents in their home in Swansea. He had never been away from home, and had never managed his own affairs. Andrew's focus at the time was graduating high school and getting into college. His parents divorced, and Andrew moved with his mom into an apartment. His mom went to back to work. Without his mother's presence during her working hours, Andrew did not have enough PCA coverage, so SCIL provided advocacy and got Andrew's hours increased. Andrew and his mom then decided he would plan to move out after graduation. By this time he was in the end of his senior year. We contacted MRC's Turning 22 / Supported Living Program and had an ITP meeting right away. Andrew obtained services from the Supported Living Program and began working with a Case Manager from Networks. Together we searched for housing, and Andrew started college at Bristol Community College, majoring in Communication. He did well and kept an A/B average. The next step was getting him moved into an apartment. He was very nervous at first, but once an apartment became available at the Hudner Building and we got him moved in, he was very happy and self sufficient.

After living on his own for about a year, Andrew had gained a lot of confidence and learned many new skills. One of his hobbies was playing poker. He began taking the bus alone, and eventually went all the way to Foxwoods totally on his own to play poker, happy to be traveling independently. He then set a goal of raising \$1,000 for a plane trip to Las Vegas to play in a poker tournament.

At the beginning of this year a more spacious apartment became available at Borden East, and Andrew accepted it. He also decided to take a break from college and focus on two of his lifelong dreams and goals. Andrew has decided to try being a professional poker player, and he has met his goal of raising \$1,000. A friend of his mother has given him her frequent flier miles to get to Vegas by plane. On May 28th of this year Andrew will be going to Vegas to play in a World Series Poker event "\$1,000 No Limit Texas Hold 'em," and the event will be aired on espn360.com. If he makes it to the last table, we can watch him. Besides poker, for many years Andrew has been writing and compiling poetry, and has decided to publish a book "Living Breathing Poetry." This project will require more financial planning.

Andrew is very content with his life, and we at SCIL are very proud of him and happy for all his accomplishments. We wish him continuing success in all his future endeavors.

Census Alert!

Please make sure you mail back your census information as soon as possible. People with disabilities have a major stake in a complete census count. Accurate numbers have an impact on programs such as Mass Health, Medicare, housing, Vocational Rehabilitation services, SSI, programs funded by the Rehabilitation Act, accessible transit, and special education for children ages 3 through 5. Federal law protects your information and your identity, and the Census Bureau cannot share your information with any other government agency, including immigration.
